Therefore mutualisms are important for

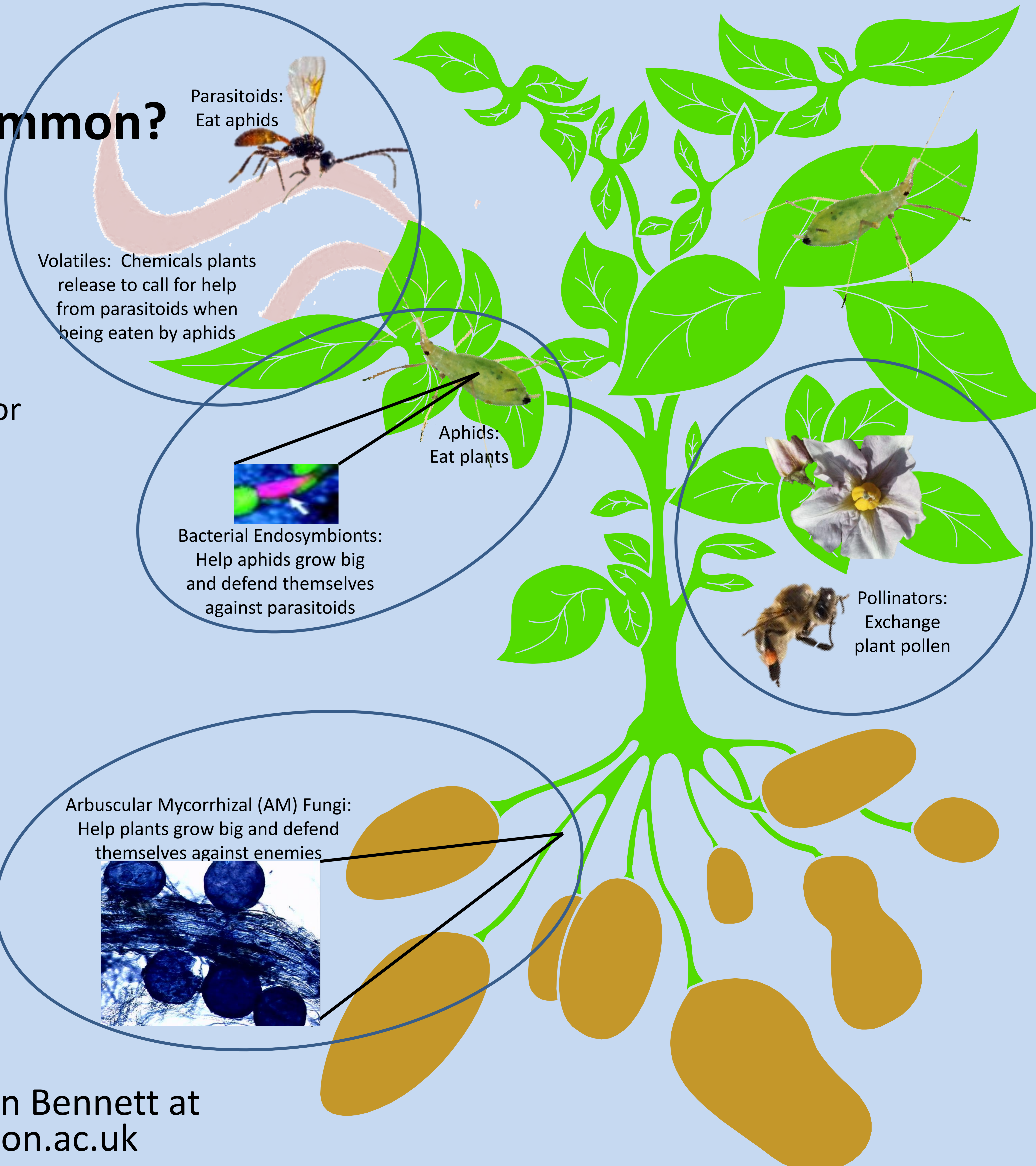
- Agriculture
